

Fall Maintenance Checklist



Regular home maintenance is a good way to protect your home and help maintain its value. Below is a checklist to use as a guide to ensure your home is safe and weather resistant. When it comes to jobs that are either too big, too hard, too time consuming, or out of your comfort zone, consider hiring a professional.

Insulate water pipes to prevent freezing		Clean eaves troughs and downspouts to ensure proper drainage.	
Test your furnace, clean the burners and lubricate the pulleys.		Water-test your roof and flashing for leaks	
Check heat-duct and water-pipe insulation.		Scan for damage outside of your home, including cracks or storm damage, and repair as needed.	0
Inspect any washing machine and dishwasher hoses for cracks or leaks, and clean the filters.		Caulk window trim and door frames.	
Learn the location of, and how to use, the water shut-off valve should you need to shut off the water.		Check your roof and flashing. Repair as needed.	
Have the furnace and air conditioner professionally serviced annually and repaired (or replaced) as necessary.		Install weather stripping on exterior doors and windows.	
Have any chimneys cleaned annually and repaired as needed.		Winterize your pool or hot tub.	0
Add or replace worn weather stripping around doors and windows to reduce air leaks and keep water from getting in.		Turn off the water supply to outdoor taps and leave the taps open to drain completely. Leave the taps in the open position until spring.	
		Clear snow away from the foundation of your house throughout the winter. If the ground is sloped 0.65 centimeters per 30 centimeters near your house, moving the snow 1-1.5 meters from your foundation will reduce problems.
